<p><b>INTRODUCTION</b> “OPENING” 5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Say to them: “Shalom!” (sha-LOAM). Tell them how to respond: Shalom</p>	<p>Say Shema, Pledge of Allegiance. Sing Song: Query to think about: Was the Ark exclusive for salvation just like Yeshua?</p>
<p><b>IDENTITY: B'NEI ISRAEL/BRIT AHM</b> 5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Share Hebrew word “Yeshua” (salvation) When G-D returns will you be ready?!”</p>	<p>Yeshua is the only way whereby we have hope of salvation.</p>
<p><b>IDENTITY: HEARER OF G-D'S WORD</b> 5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Read Portions: Bereshit 6:9-11:32 (7:1-16) Isaiah 54:1-55:5 (54:9-13) Matthew 24:36-44 (24:36-44)</p> <p>Learn our memory verse for the book of Bereshit. <p><b>IDENTITY: BELIEVER OF G-D'S WORD</b> 5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Discussion- Was there another way beside the ark Noach built?</p>	<p>Ask: - Who was saved outside the ark?</p>
<p><b>IDENTITY: FOLLOWER OF G-D'S WORD</b> 5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Ask: What should be our response to those who say all roads lead to G-D?</p>	<p>Discuss: Do we have an obligation to those outside of G-Ds family?</p>

<p><b>IDENTITY: DOER OF G-D'S WORD</b></p> <p>5 MINUTES</p>	<p>Who we are is largely dependent upon what we do; we understand and act on the knowledge of the exclusivity of Yeshua for salvation.</p>	<p>Ask: How do we get onboard with the salvation that G-D has offered HIS people?</p>
<p><b>GAME/ACTIVITY</b></p>	<p>Who is G-D</p>	<p>Who is G-D on one hand?</p>
<p><b>HOMEWORK</b></p> <p>3 MINUTES</p>	<p>Our letter of the month is Tav. Look around your house for something that begins with the “ט” sound. “Shavua tov, until next week!”</p>	<p>Close with prayer: say out loud what you are grateful for and things you need prayer for today.</p>

**NOTES**

The first goal is to approach all scripture with humility and prayer.

**Rabbi's Drash:**

Have you ever tried to do everything right? To make all the right choices? To do everything exactly how you should do it? Yet no matter how hard you tried you couldn't do everything right? You are not alone. In this week's Parsha, we learn that Noah and for that matter every person ever has the same problems. In Genesis 6:9 we read.

**9These are the genealogies of Noah. Noah was a righteous man. He was blameless among his generation. Noah continually walked with God.**

When you read this verse, you might think that it is saying Noah didn't ever do anything wrong. But that is not true. What it is saying is because Noah walked with Ad-nai continually Ad-nai considered Noah righteous and blameless. It was walking with Ad-nai that made Noah righteous, and it is walking with Ad-nai that makes us righteous today.

Walking with Ad-nai is the only way to not miss the boat. Yeshua is the only way to be made righteous. Ad-nai is the exclusive way to be saved.

**John 14:6 (TLV)** - Yeshua said to him, “I am the way, the truth, and the life! No one comes to the Father except through Me.

**John 17:3 (TLV)** - And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Yeshua the Messiah, the One You sent.

**Acts 4:12 (TLV)** - There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved!”

**John 3:36 (TLV)** - He who trusts in the Son has eternal life. He who does not obey the Son will not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him.

If you do not have volunteers -ask for a volunteer to lead the pledge of allegiance. Not so Secret point mark with a star ★ next to name on sign in sheet.

Ask one of them to lead the Shema? Not so Secret point

If anyone is misbehaving, ask the entire class. “What is the first rule in Shabbat School?” They should answer “Love your neighbour as yourself.”

Say to the offender “Sir/Ma’am, are you showing love for your neighbours?”

Give them a moment to respond and then tell them “This is your only warning, if you choose to disturb the class again \_\_\_\_\_ will escort you out, and you will have to explain your behaviour to your parents.

Understood?” wait for them to respond with a “Yes Ma’am”, or “Yes Rebbitzen”. Follow through. (This part is the hardest for all of us.). Anyone that must be escorted out will lose all their points for the day.

Please use Sir and Ma’am and expect them to be equally respectful.

Explain to yeladim that the teachers are responsible for:

- Helping you understand Torah
- Teaching you Hebrew and prayers
- Listening to your hopes, and goals
- Helping your team meet its goals
- Helping you understand who you are as a Messianic believer
- Helping you grow closer to G-D.

Explain to yeladim that they are responsible for:

- Coming to Shabbat School prepared to learn
- Getting with in place for the “Opening Ceremony”
- Being attentive and curious and asking lots of questions
- Being respectful and participating in activities and discussions.
